Growing Stronger in 2026

As Singapore moves toward becoming a super-aged society, we have been proactively looking into strengthening and expanding our services to better meet the evolving needs of seniors.

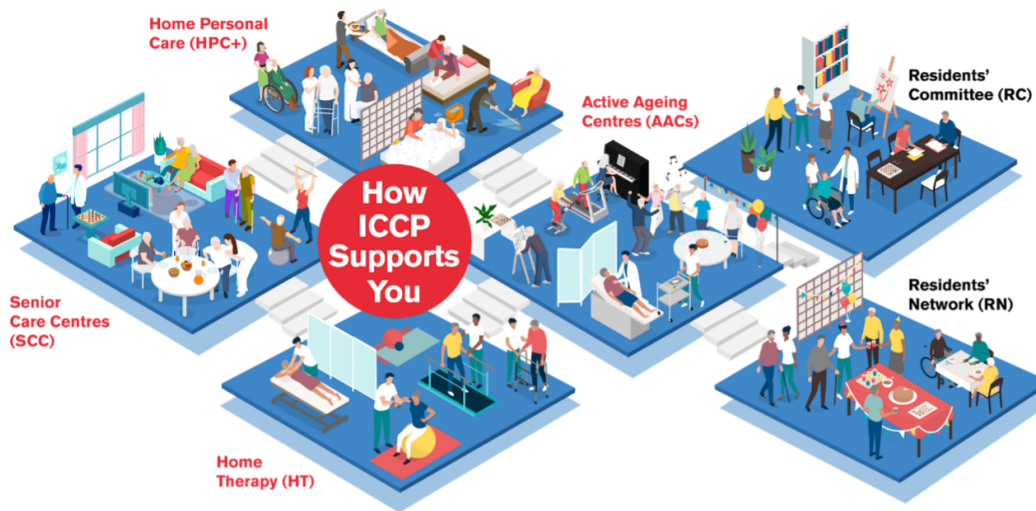
According to the Ministry of Health, about 1 in 4 Singaporeans will be aged 60 and above by 2030. In preparation for the future, Singapore has introduced the Integrated Community Care Provider (ICCP) model to strengthen and streamline care for seniors as the population ages.



SASCO is extremely proud to share that we have been awarded lead Integrated Community Care Provider (ICCP) for Sengkang Sub Region 3 and Bedok Sub-Region 4. As the lead for these regions, SASCO will work closely with various eldercare service providers in the vicinity to enable seniors to age well in place.

What is ICCP?

As the lead ICCP, SASCO would serve as a central point of contact for seniors and their caregivers to seek support for nearly anything they may need, such as active ageing programmes, befriending support, day care, rehabilitation, just to name a few. This ensures that seniors will have convenient access to help and resources in a timely manner, allowing them to age comfortably at home rather than in hospitals or residential facilities.



We are especially excited to take on responsibility for overseeing Bedok Sub-Region 4, where there is a major gap in the eldercare services available. We are extremely grateful for this opportunity to start on a clean slate and bring essential care and services to the region.

Here's a special shoutout to all our dedicated staff, valued partners and most importantly, our benevolent supporters, as your trust and commitment has allowed us to reach even more seniors.

We are also delighted to share that we are currently preparing for two more Active Ageing Centres and two more Senior Care Centres, to be up and running by 2027. For these projects, we will also be working with other ICCP leads to cover the service gaps of various regions in Singapore.

On top of what we are already doing, we will be launching additional services very soon, which we are looking forward to sharing more details on in the coming months.

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
