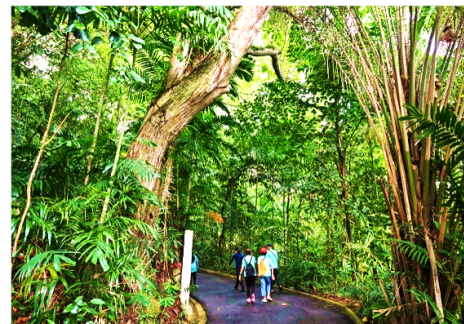


To Our 60s & Beyond

Besides taking care of the elderly who attend to our facilities, SASCO Home takes great care to monitor and do routine checks on the elderly living within the vicinity. Whilst doing these visits, we also distribute care packs containing essential items whenever we can afford to, to remind these seniors that there are people looking out for them.

Many seniors that we have met face daily struggles, including limited mobility, restricted finances, isolation, which severely impact their ability to take care of themselves and their household needs. Working together, our determined staff and volunteers begin their mission of compassion and outreach. Here is some insight on what goes into these visits.

Preparing these packages can take a few days up to a week, as we must gather a variety of items which includes food and household items, hygiene and cleaning products, as well as basic medical supplies like masks. Everything is then carefully assembled into reusable bags.





As the elderly recipients live scattered across several blocks, our team of staff and volunteers gather as early as 6AM to cover as much grounds as they can within the day.

Volunteers are trained not just to hand over items, but to check in on the well-being of the seniors where possible, asking if they are feeling okay, if they require assistance or advice on any issues they are facing. In such circumstances where the senior needs assistance, our staff and volunteers try their best to help them on the spot, or make sure there will be a follow up as soon as possible.

For many of these seniors, these visits are more than just a delivery of supplies, it is also a lifeline, both physically and emotionally.

Charity work becomes truly meaningful through the collective efforts of so many individuals, from the generosity of donors whose contributions provide essential resources, to the dedication of staff and volunteers who consistently show up to distribute those resources to those in need. It is precisely these combined efforts that have helped countless seniors feel seen, valued, and connected.

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
